



Overview

In Art and Design, home learning forms an integral part of the course of study and schemes of work. Students have the opportunity to complete outstanding work at lunchtimes in AR2/AR1 for Art, or to use AR3 computers for Photography. There are also after school sessions for both courses Tuesday and Wednesday after school

Expectations

All students will be expected to complete meaningful home learning tasks at each Key Stage. The department recognises the value and importance of the role of home learning as a means of;

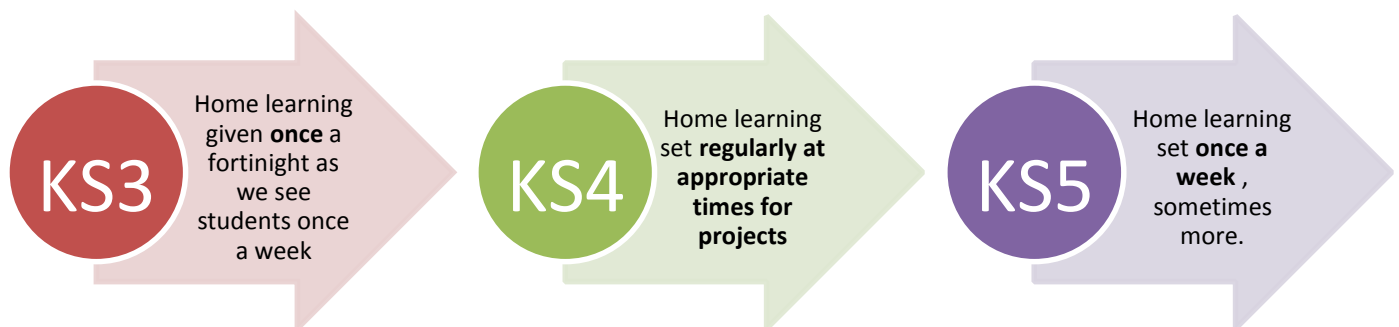
- Developing the students' knowledge and understanding
- Developing students' subject specific key skills in order to prepare them for further studies in Art and Design
- Supporting key skills of literacy, numeracy and communication where appropriate
- Supporting learning in subsequent lessons
- Challenging and stretching students through curiosity
- Developing independent learning skills
- Providing opportunities of feedback from adults in order to evaluate success and quality of their work

Implementation

The department aims to support expectations by:

- Setting meaningful home learning tasks in accordance with the whole school home learning policy.
- Linking home learning to work covered in class (connect the learning)
- Marking home learning promptly and with constructive feedback
- Providing students with an opportunity to 'FIXIT' following feedback
- At KS4 and KS5 by offering meaningful interim assessment opportunities and feedback designed to assist students to develop and improve their work
- Rewarding effort and quality of home learning via the schools reward policy
- Responding to those students whose work is incomplete and/or fails to meet the required standard through the use of:
 - A department detention, focusing on the student completing the home learning task
 - A phone call home
 - A learning conversation or one to one support

Breakdown for each Year Group

Key Stage:	KS3
Year Group:	Year 7, 8 and 9
Overview	In Years 7, 8 and 9, students will receive homework once a fortnight. Most of these home learning tasks will relate to class work, students may also be asked to research at home or collect resources for their next task.
Duration of Home Learning	This homework should take between 20 and 50 minutes to complete.

Key Stage:	KS4-Art	KS4-Photography
Year Group:	Years 10 and 11	Years 10 and 11
Overview	In these academic years every student will be completing the GCSE - AQA Art and Design course. This course is 60% coursework and as such has to be largely completed in school. Students may be asked to complete planning and research at home or to collect resources for their tasks.	In these academic years every student will be completing the GCSE - AQA Photography course. This course is 60% coursework and as such has to be largely completed in school. Students may be asked to complete planning and research at home or to collect resources for their tasks.
Duration of Home Learning	Students will need to dedicate approximately 2-3 hours of their time to ensure they meet deadlines	

Key Stage:	KS5
Year Group:	Years 12 and 13
Overview	In these academic years every student will be completing the GCE - AQA Art and Design course. In AS Art and Design course work= 30% of Advanced GCE / 60% of AS A2 Unit 3 course work =60% of the total marks and 30% of the total GCE marks Coursework has to be largely completed in school, students may be asked to complete planning and research at home or to collect resources for their tasks.
Duration of Home Learning	The amount of time needed for this is about 5 hours a week to ensure that they complete the work by the deadlines set.
